The Board reviewed the website upgrades that are now "live". Dan Quiinn will also be updating all of the "how to" videos and post them on the Website FAQ section.

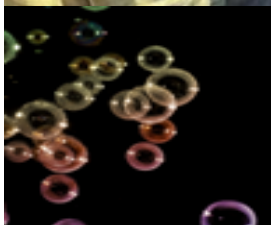
The Board has decided to maintain the number of Board members at it`s current level of 13 for the 2026/2027 elections'.

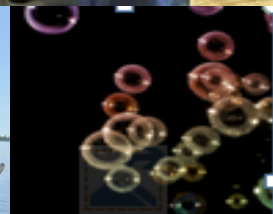

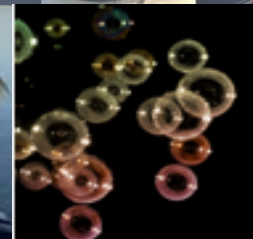

There were also names that I remember from back in the day.... like John Cook, Bill Pereira, and Larry Zukowski. John Burke then read a very warm and heart-felt email he received from our former regional vice president (who went onto become the president of Osco Drug), Dave Maher. His email detailed how much joy it brought to him working in the eastern region. It detailed how he could not have had the success out here without the hard working and dedicated staff he had working under him. He also pointed out so many people from our region that went on to work in higher positions within the company. He summed up his email to assure to all of us that him and his wife Marilyn were in relatively good health and enjoying life at 86 years old.

My wife and I then left the group and headed home. On our drive home, she continued to ask questions about many of the people she met that day and wanted to get a feel for what my career life was like back in my Osco days. It was not only a great day because I got to see so many people that I kind of grew up with, but I exposed my wife to a different phase in my life and she got to meet some of the people that I worked with, made friends with, and became a part of what my career evolved into.
